What Can You Do Now?

- Create a **College Foundation of North Carolina (CFNC)** account
- Work on an activities resume.
- Create a Big Future account at College Board (www.collegeboard.org).
- Look at the Scholarship Bulletin on the Student Services website.
- Visit with college reps as they come to Enloe HS.
- Make this summer count: educational programs, summer job, travel, volunteering. See Summer Opportunities on our website and at CFNC.
- Research Colleges: Visit college campuses now. NC has 110 university, college and community college campuses, many nearby.

Considerations for Senior Schedules

- Keep in mind your graduation requirements: 4 English, 4 Math, 4 Social Studies, 3 Science, 1 Healthful Living and 6 elective credits (2 from Arts, CTE or World Language).
- Review admissions requirements of potential colleges.
- Strive for balance while avoiding an all AP schedule—you will need time for college applications, financial aid forms and scholarship applications.

My College Quick Start: Use access code from PSAT score report (Counselors have copies if you need them)

Things to Keep Track of:

- ◆ Keep a calendar of college and scholarship application deadlines.
- ◆ Make a plan for when to complete all applications—do not wait until the last day to submit.
- ◆ Have you checked Student Services timeline in comparison with your application deadline?
- ◆ Have you asked your counselor in advance to submit all necessary supporting documents?
- ◆ Do you know who will be writing your teacher recommendations?
- ◆ Have you asked someone to read your college essay?

Fall Timeline:

Early September: Counselors provide senior orientation lesson (specific timelines for college applications, in-house procedures for transcripts and letter of recommendations, etc.).

Early September: College Panel night for seniors and parents (counselors present college application information as well as Q&A session with college admission representatives).

Beginning mid-September: Senior meetings (every senior has meeting with assigned counselor to discuss credits needed for graduation and plans after high school).

Beginning mid-September: College recommendation sessions (seniors who need letters of recommendations for applications, completed in order of sign-up and application deadline).

End of September: Beginning rank is run for senior class—transcripts can be sent after this process.
